On Friday afternoon, Beaverton Branch is excited to offer you four different Enrichment Tours, all of which will be preceded by lunch on your own at a restaurant near each Tour site.

ENRICHMENT TOUR #1: **St. Josef's Winery**. St. Josef's Winery, located in Canby, has produced award-winning Pinot Noir and Pinot Gris wines from Oregon's Willamette Valley since 1983. It is family-owned and operated with four vineyards and a tasting room. The winery's acreage now includes five vineyards producing award-winning reds and whites. Their philosophy is simple: they are European and like to drink nice wines with their meals! The winery's tasting room will be open for our group.

ENRICHMENT TOUR #2: **Barn Owl Nursery** is a home-based retail business specializing in herbs, founded in 1982. Over 200 varieties of locally grown herb plants are available for sale and admiration, including some which are hard to find elsewhere.. Barn Owl Nursery's specialty includes the growth and sale of nearly one hundred cultivars of lavender plants. Dried herbs and flowers harvested from the nursery's gardens, or picked from other Northwest gardens, are for sale in the drying room. Lavender flowers are sold fresh and dried during the season and are the largest harvest at the nursery. The nursery is located near Wilsonville. ENRICHMENT TOUR #3: **Medical Teams International's** exhibit, located the organization's headquarters in Tualatin, is a walk-through; multi-sensory exhibit that allows people to experience what real life is like for children affected by disaster, conflict and poverty. Their ultimate goal is to serve worldwide people stricken by disaster, conflict and poverty with the most effective programs possible. They use internationally accepted guidelines that are determined by the global health community.

ENRICHMENT TOUR #4: **Tualatin River National Wildlife Refuge** is one of only a handful of urban national wildlife refuges in the country. Tour participants will enjoy an easy walk through the refuge guided by Kim Strassburg, Visitor Services Manager. Situated within the floodplain of the Tualatin River, the Refuge comprises less than 1% of the 712 square mile watershed. The Refuge is now home to nearly 200 species of birds, over 50 species of mammals, 25 species of reptiles and amphibians, and a wide variety of insects, fish and plants. The Refuge is located in Sherwood.
